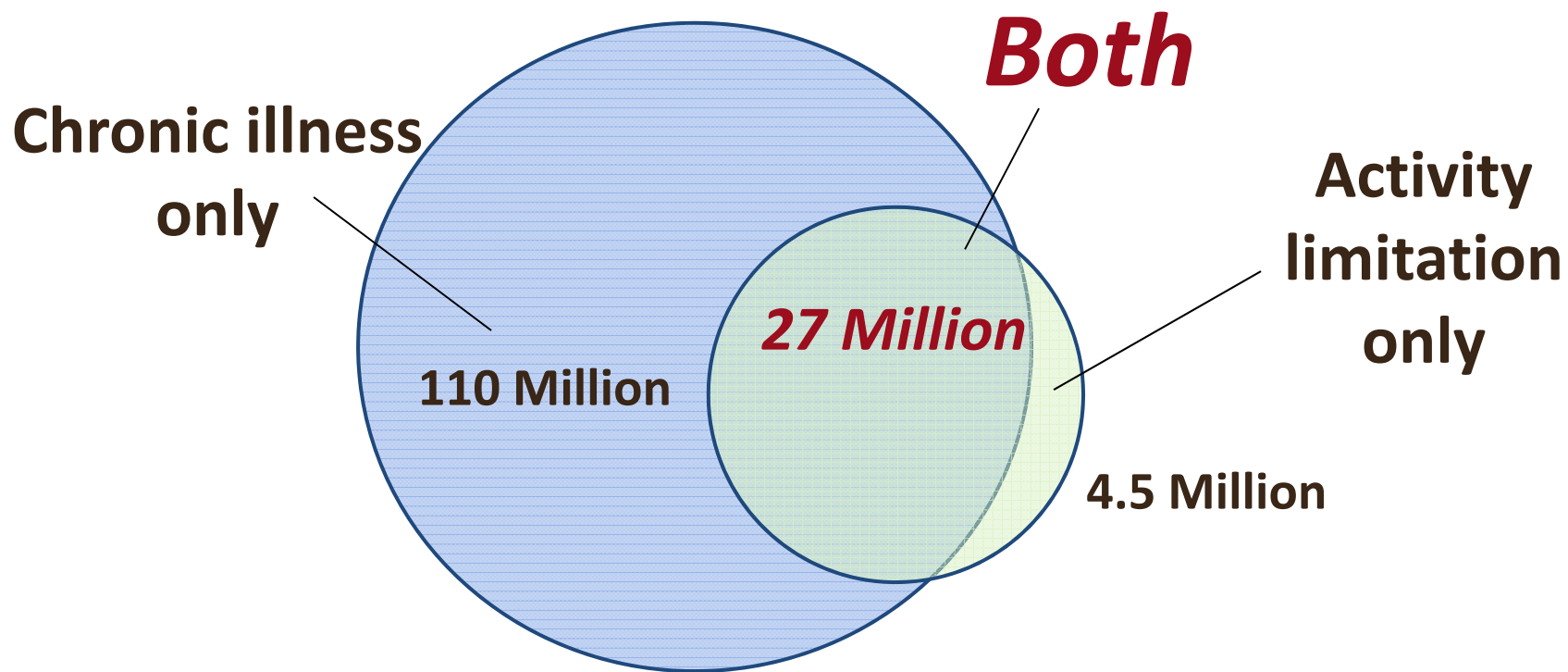

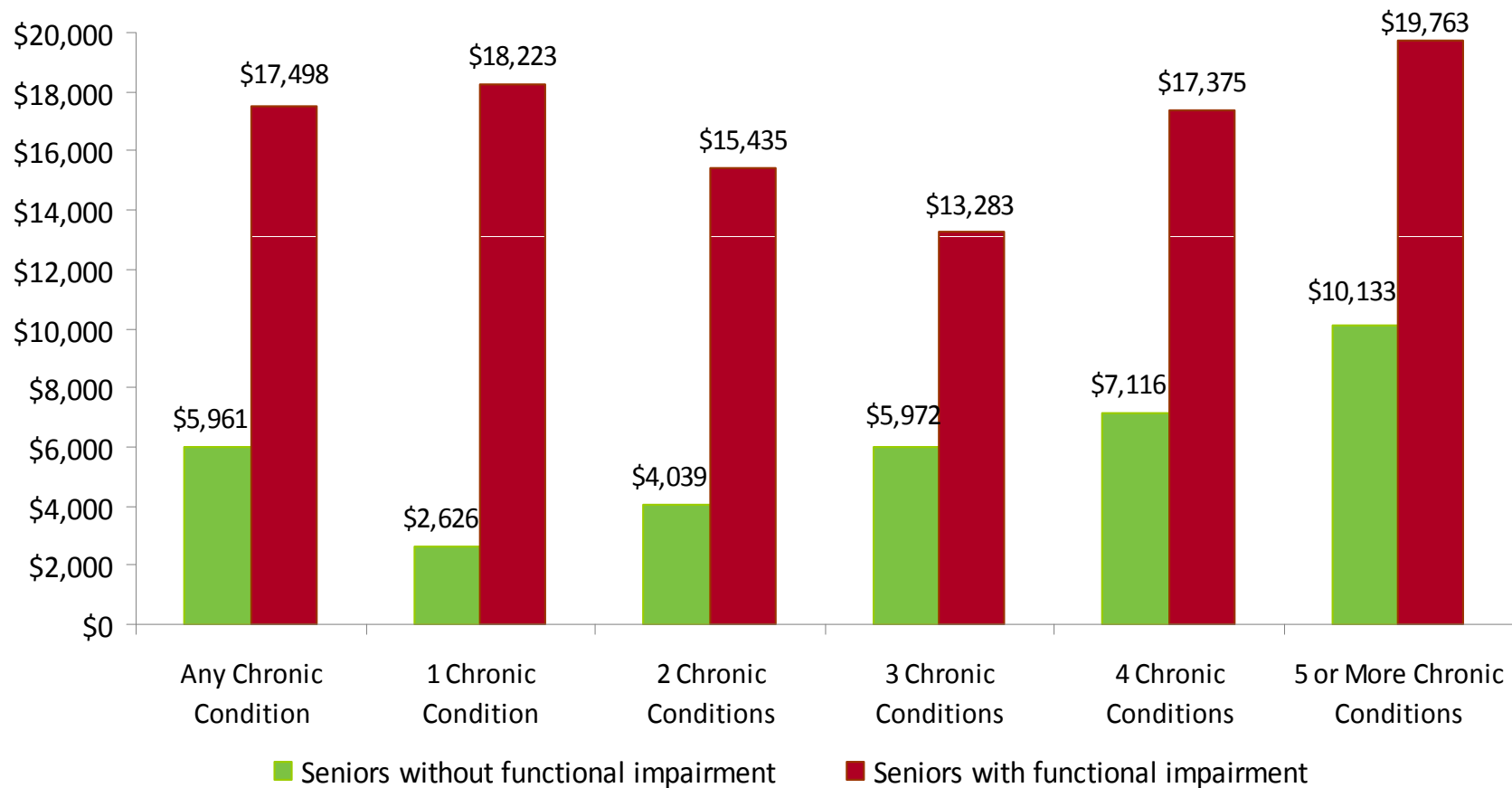

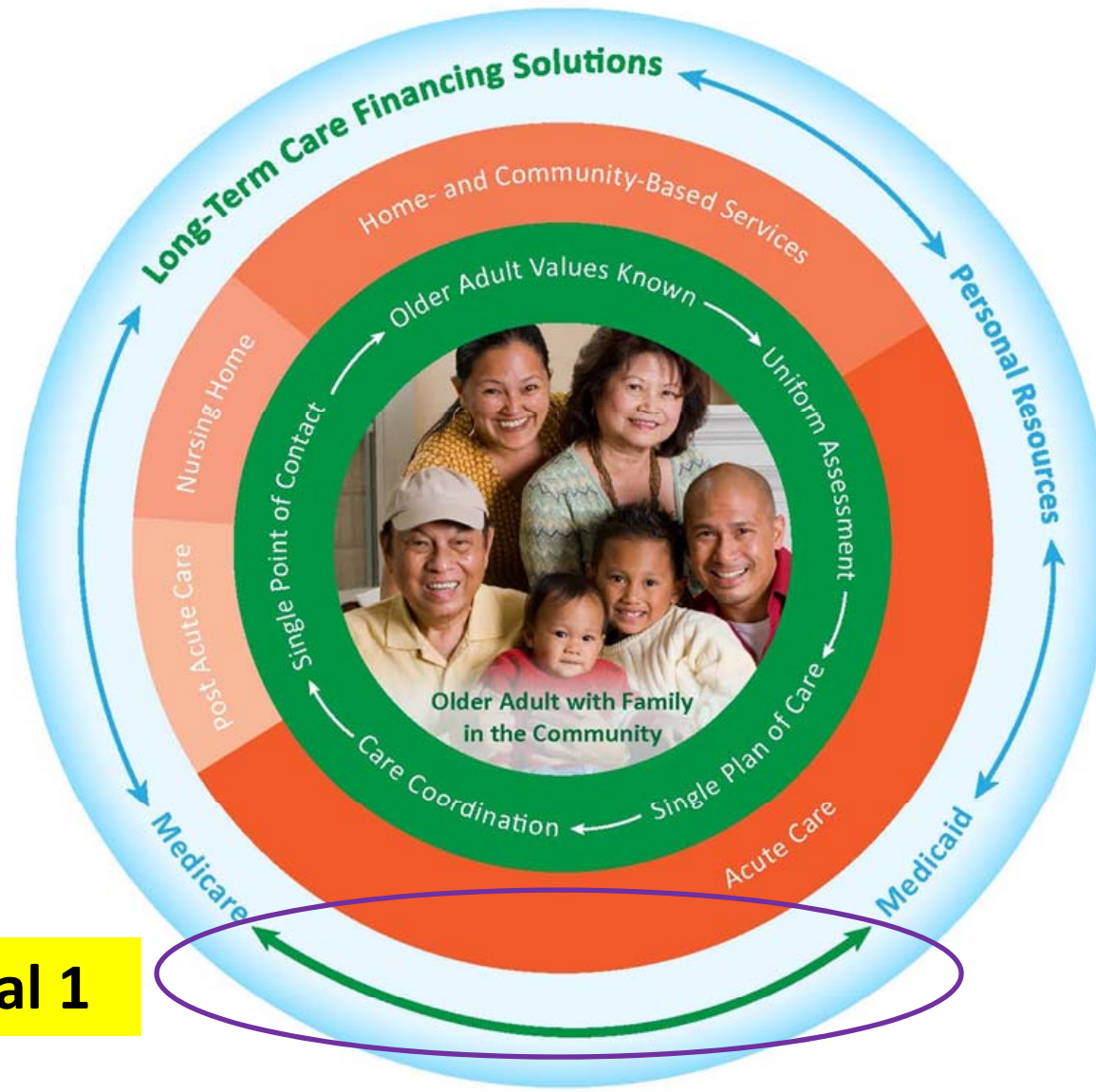
3 Thematic Goals

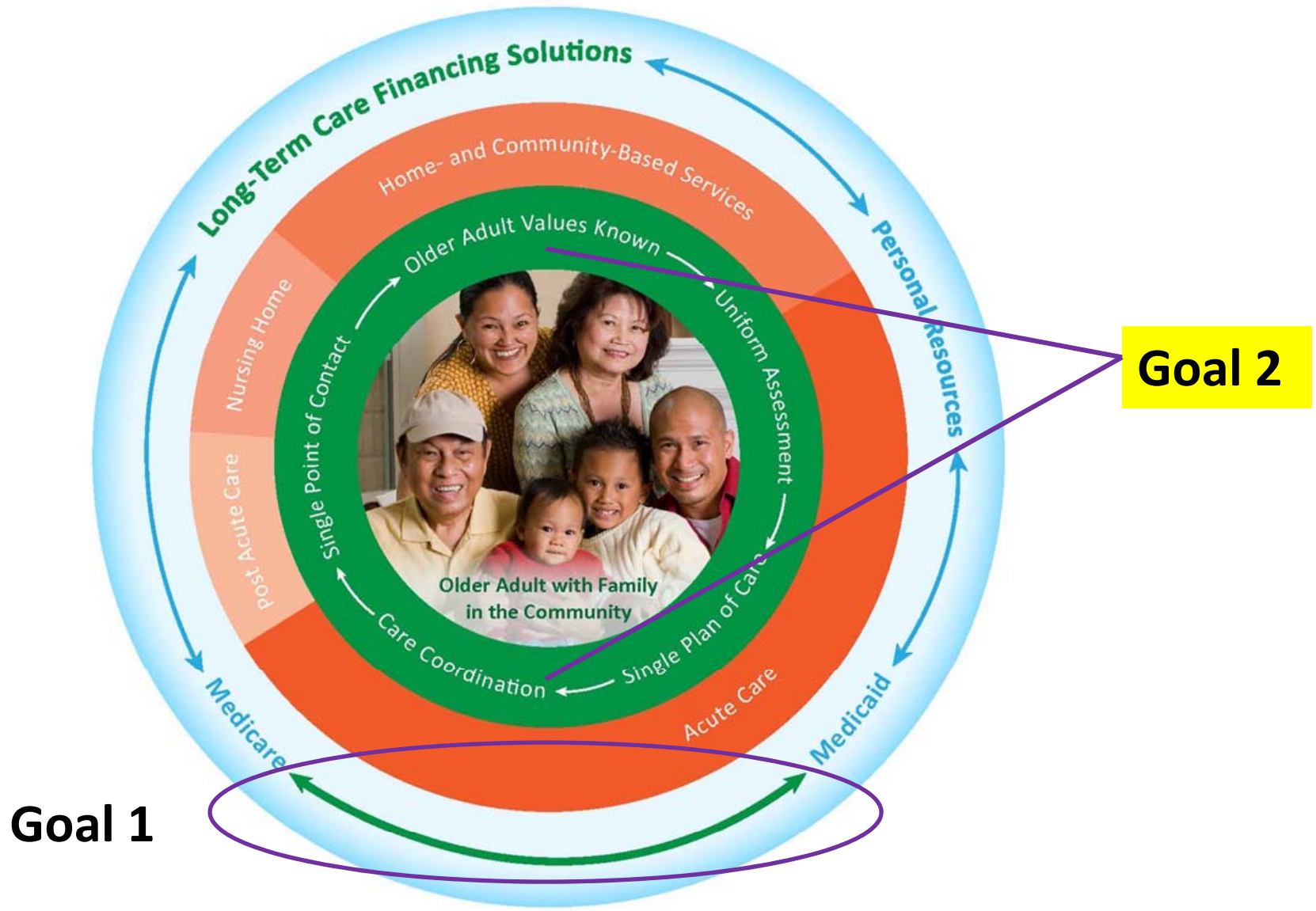

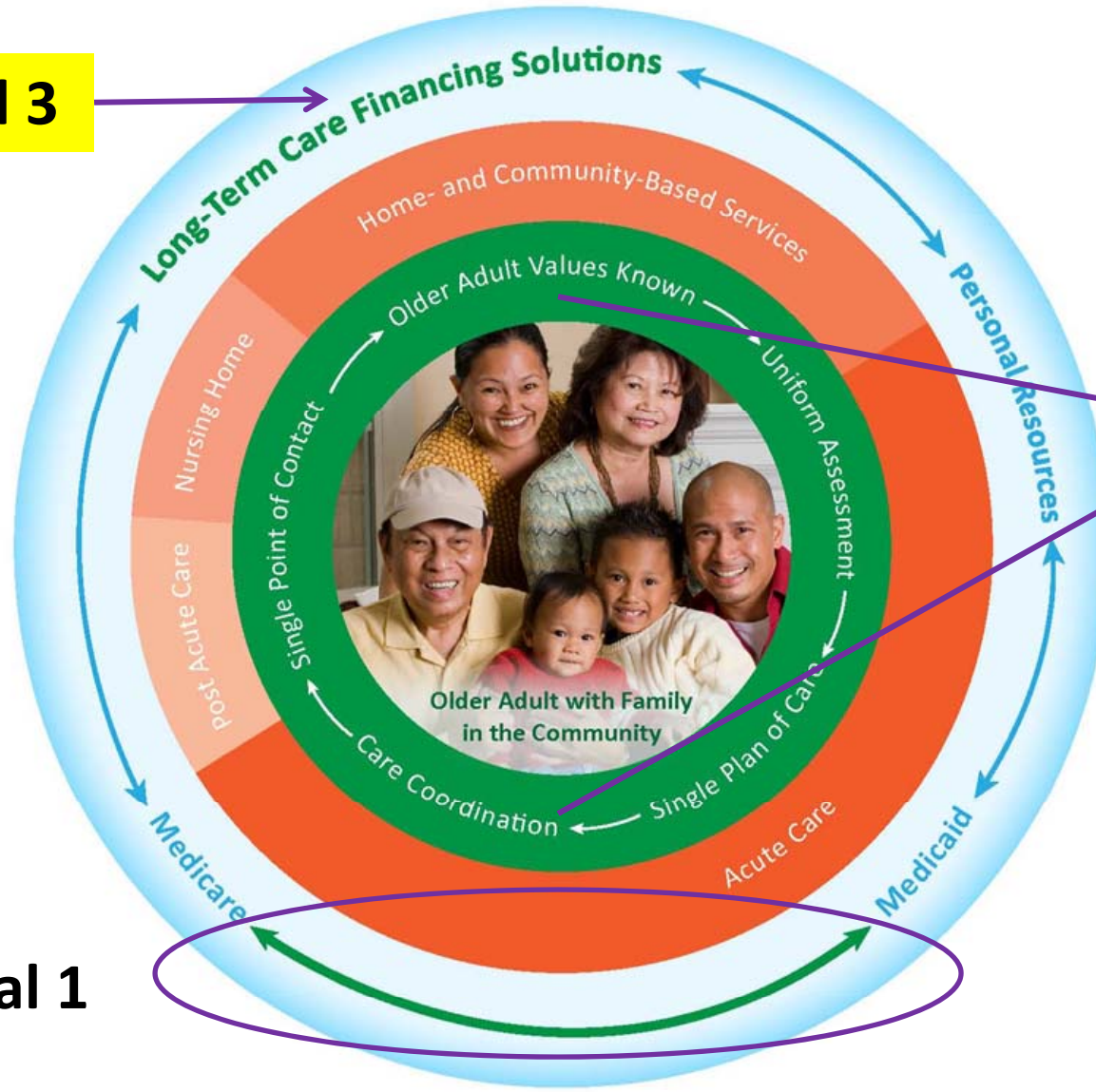
